Non-Resident Tuition Exemption (Dream Act) Application Checklist

Please assemble and provide all required documents listed below to apply for the Non-Resident Tuition Exemption (Dream Act). Please email or call Residency Reclassification Services with questions. Applications and all required documents are to be mailed or dropped off to the Residency Reclassification Services office.

2.	Verification of High School Graduation (Copy of diploma or official transcript):
3.	Copy of an affidavit regarding filing of application to become a permanent resident within 30 days after the individual becomes eligible to so (if applicable):
4.	Documentation of registration with the Selective Service System (if applicable):
5.	Comptroller-certified copies of annual Maryland state income tax returns for the 3-year period before the applicable semester that were filed by either the individual or the individual's parent/legal guardian and include a Maryland address:
6.	Individual's birth certificate or the individual's legal guardianship documentation matching the name of tax filer if the filer is a person other than the student: (Please be advised that if the birth certificate or guardianship documentation was not originally issued in English, the application must include a translated copy in which the original language was translated into English prior to submission of the application. Please include copies of both the translated and original documents.)
returr Office	Maryland Income Tax returns, attach Maryland Comptroller's certified copies of each Maryland tax no obtain Maryland Comptroller's certified copies, submit Form 129 to the Maryland Comptroller's in person or by following the instructions on the form. Visit the Maryland Comptroller's Office web to find Form 129 or visit a branch office near you to request the certified taxes in-person.
